



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN PDGA EUROPE AND THE EUROPEAN DISC GOLF FEDERATION (EDGF) FOR THE YEARS 2025 – 2028

This Memorandum of Understanding outlines the basis for the relationship between PDGA Europe and the European Disc Golf Federation (EDGF), and defines the roles and responsibilities of each organization in Europe. The objectives of this agreement are to outline and to foster mutual recognition and cooperation between PDGA Europe and EDGF.

1. Recognition

a. EDGF recognizes that:

PDGA Europe is the European branch of the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA), the global governing body of the sport of disc golf. The PDGA governs the rules and standards of the sport, provides official PDGA player ratings to its members and sanctions competitive events for players of all skill levels, including the Major Championships. As part of the PDGA, PDGA Europe holds the rights to organize Major Championships in Europe, including Open divisions, Women, Amateurs, Masters and Juniors.

The name of the association is PDGA Europe ry. The association is based in Helsinki, Finland. PDGA Europe consists of individual members who receive benefits of membership per the PDGA Europe bylaws.

PDGA Europe is dedicated to the promotion and sustainable growth of disc golf in Europe, being fully aligned with the PDGA's global mission.

Through the PDGA International Program, PDGA/PDGA Europe collaborates with National Disc Golf and Disc Sports Associations (the "Affiliated Countries"), as listed in the annual PDGA International Program Guide.

b. PDGA Europe recognizes that:

The European Disc Golf Federation (EDGF) is the federative governing body of disc golf in Europe. As part of the European Flying Disc Federation (EFDF) and World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF), EDGF represents its member countries in matters related to the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

EDGF owns and governs the European Disc Golf Championships in any forms. EDGF is dedicated to strengthen the further development of the organizational sports structure towards the European Sport Model.

EDGF also promotes the growth of disc golf in Europe with a strong focus on collaboration with national federations.

The EDGF is a non-profit association registered in Switzerland, governed by the statutes and by the Articles of the Swiss Civil Code.

2. Cooperation

Both parties will respect and uphold the authorities of the other party as described in (1) above.

Through this MOU, PDGA Europe and EDGF intend to publicly announce their cooperation and mutual intention to foster an open and transparent relationship with the disc golf community. The parties will cooperate in the general promotion and development of disc golf in Europe, including supporting the establishment and development of the NDGBs. (National Disc Golf Governing Bodies)

Both parties commit to professional and respectful communication at all levels, ensuring clarity and cooperation in developing disc golf in Europe. Any issues should be addressed internally to find the best solutions. PDGA Europe shall be the main channel for any PDGA related questions, feedback and other matters.


3. Term

This agreement begins on January 1, 2025, and ends on December 31, 2028, unless terminated earlier by written notice from either party. Continued cooperation between PDGA Europe and EDGF beyond 2028 will be evaluated through a joint review no later than mid-2028.


