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# Welcome

Thank you for your interest in hosting an EDGF event in 2027 (2029), one of the most prestigious events in the sport of disc golf and in Europe. This comprehensive bid package has been carefully developed to guide you in creating a strong and compelling proposal. As you develop your submission, this Event Bid Manual — along with the specific bid package(s) for the event(s) you are applying to host — should serve as your go-to resource. Together, they outline the expectations, requirements, standards, and responsibilities involved in organizing a successful EDGF event. A checklist is also included in the bid package to help you prepare your submission.

Your bid is more than just a proposal — it is a detailed blueprint of your operational plans. It should provide all the necessary information to allow EDGF to make an informative and fair decision when selecting the most qualified hosts. “The more detail the better”. If your bid is approved, it will also serve as a foundational planning tool throughout the lead-up to the event.

These guidelines will form the basis of the event agreement contract and represent a key part of the commitment made by your Local Organizing Committee (LOC). The formal agreement will be shared with your team upon the awarding of the event. # EDGF European Disc Golf Championships

- **EDGC (European Disc Golf Championships),**
- **EJDGC (European Juniors Disc Golf Championships, and**
- **EMDGC (European Masters Disc Golf Championships)**

are the officially recognized competition formats for determination of the European Disc Golf Champions in all divisions offered. They provide conditions for the highest level of play for European players as well as the opportunity to all European disc golf countries to be represented on the highest level.

The rules of EDGC, EJDGC and EMDGC determined by EDGF in accordance with the **“EDGF Events Format & Standards”**, approved by the EDGF General Assembly.

The junior divisions MJ18 and FJ18 at EDGC are organized in a formally separate event. To allow all age eligible players from Europe to compete in the EJDGC regardless of their PDGA Pro/Am status, the EJDGC official divisions are MPO/FPO. EJDGC and EDGC share the same tournament directors and the assistant tournament director. They also share, date, location, course(s) and all general organization.

## EDGF Objectives

- A fair and safe competition.
- Presentation of European Championships that are attractive to sponsors, and/or, tourism authority, and is of benefit to the NDGGB’s objectives of developing the sport at a high level.
- Maximization of media exposure for the EDGC, EJDGC and EMDGC nationally and globally.
- Engagement of public institutions.
- Establishing strong partnership of all parties involved.

## Local Organizing Committee

The Local Organizing Committee (LOC) is comprised of:

- The NDGGB in the hosting country.
- The legal entity representing the organizers.
- The host city.
- The owners/management of the tournament site property.

The LOC is encouraged to develop visionary proposals that can enhance the scope, presentation and marketing of the event(s). Priority will be given to existing organizing structures that have followed the ideal development path of hosting national events, series events or regional events and already delivered high quality events.

The LOC must be fully aware of the concept, format, and scope of EDGC, EJDGC and EMDGC, as envisioned by EDGF and its partners as defined in this document, and EDGF standards.

## Rights & Contract

EDGF exclusively owns the rights to the events and signs individual contracts or joint contracts (“Event Contract”) with the LOC. The event contract between EDGF and the LOC specifies the detailed event related arrangements to the minimum extent specified by the EDGC Standards, as well as rights and responsibilities of EDGF and the LOC.

## Bid Application Content

For the bid application, EDGF will provide a specific online registration form; including the possibility to upload files (also see point 7. Documentation Guidelines). The form is sectioned to lead you through the application.

The following materials should be provided with your online bid application:

- Official letters of support by NDGGB, Host City, Venue, Local Authorities, other Public Institutions, Partner & Sponsors (if already known, Media).
- The proposed structure of the LOC, legal entity description, proposed staff size, and experience of personnel.
- Preliminary Event Budget. EDGF can provide a sample budget form (Excel), which you can download in two versions on the bidding website.
- City, area maps (google) and course map (if available from previous events).
- Media-, Marketing Plan

## Documentation Guidelines

- Documents should be prepared in a simple format at modest costs.
- All submitted documents must be in English.
- Supporting letter -> PDF
- Budget -> Excel
- Images -> JPG or PNG
- Course maps -> PDF
- Other maps and diagrams -> PDF
- Videos -> Link to YouTube

## Bid Evaluation and Selection

- Bids are reviewed by the EDGF Championships Committee; the committee evaluates the bids and makes the official recommendation to the EDGF BoD (within one (1) week period).
- EDGF BoD reviews the bid materials, considers the recommendation of the EDGF Championship Committee, selects the hosts (within one (1) week period), and makes the official announcement (within two (2) days period).
- EDGF may ask to provide additional information, on short notice during the evaluation process.
- EDGF may eliminate bids that are not in line with the required criteria and/or the EDGF Event Format & Standards.
- The EDGF Board of Directors will make the final decision of the event hosts.

## Bid Process Timeline

- EDGF publishes the bid call as early as possible, at least 15 months in advance before the expected event date; public announcement about the dates of bid call opening should be released at least one (1) month prior the bid call opening: **to be communicated**.
- EDGF sets the application deadline that will allow at least six (6) weeks for preparation of the bids after bid call opening: **to be communicated**.
- Bidders need to submit complete bid materials by the imposed deadline, no late submission is allowed except in case the deadline is extended by the decision of the EDGF Board of Directors.
- In case it is needed EDGF BoD can extend this deadline, BoD needs to inform its members about the extension at least 2 days prior to the originally imposed deadline.
- Decision about the winners of the bids: In general, up to 4 weeks after submission: **to be communicated**.
